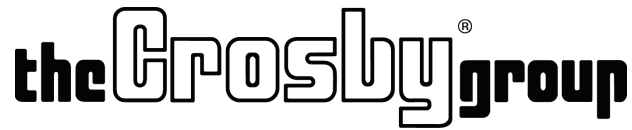

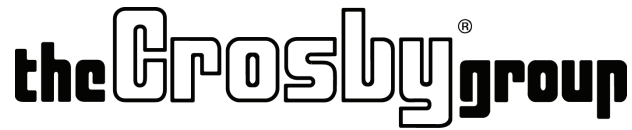

Note: Although OSHA does not make reference; ANSI A10.42-2000 "Safety Requirements for Rigging Qualifications and Responsibilities" is a good resource to review and consider utilizing. This standard establishes minimum criteria of knowledge and performance requirements for a "qualified" rigger in the construction industry. It also states that any "qualified" and/or "competent" trainer can be used to impart the information to an employee and methods of training are not restricted. It also requires that "Records of Training" be kept by the employer. Only the most current applicable training records are necessary to be kept on file.
